


Looking Back, We Celebrate

25 YEARS OF TRANSFORMATION

Timeline Highlights

1993 ENLACE is founded by Ron Bueno & David Bueno in El Salvador with Lic. Dora Reinoza as its first employee.

First church & community project, a retaining wall in Bonanza with El Buen Samaritano Church.

entrepreneurs in Bonanza. Eventually the credit program would grow and become the credit union, Credatec, which has lent almost \$4,000,000 to small-scale entrepreneurs and continues to increase families' income and reduce poverty to this day.

First water project in San Jose El Naranjo with the Jeursalén Church. 94 more church-led clean water projects would eventually serve over 35,000 people in El Salvador improving health & reducing infant mortality.

1998 Fifth year in which international service teams join the work alongside local churches & communities in El Salvador. Over 350 short-term service teams have created long-term impact for over 20 years.

El Salvador experiences a 7.9 magnitude earthquake taking almost 1,000 lives and displacing over 200,000 people. Churches lead relief and rebuilding efforts aided by staff and international volunteers.



First health clinic built in remote village of Abelines with the Piedra Angular Church. Eventually this small church would lead projects including clean water, electricity, new homes, latrines, home gardens & bridges for the entire community.

U.S. Office is established in California with Larry Kasper as its first employee.

David & Jenny McGee move to El Salvador, joining a long line of incredible volunteers who have loved & served sacrificially over the years.

First Pastors & Leaders Retreat in El Salvador attended by 4 churches & 14 leaders, would eventually grow to 67 churches & 363 people.

First 100 homes built in El Tinteral led by Antioquia,
Eben-ezer & Monte Sion churches with funding
from International Concern.

CVW Family Foundation funds the launch of the Church & Community Program, which would ultimately equip and empower 132 churches (over 2,250 leaders) in community transformation.

People were so excited to collaborate with the church. Now local leaders include the church in making decisions for the community.







Since 1993 all projects were...

Locally identified / churches listened, engaged and collaborated with their communities effectively.

Locally funded / every dollar raised internationally was matched and leveraged through local contributions of funds, materials and labor.

Locally managed and sustained / churches and community organizations were connected, strengthened and empowered to maintain and develop future projects.




GOING DEEP IN EL SALVADOR

We are on track to equip 150 churches in community transformation directly impacting over 500,000 people or 50% of those in the greatest need in the country.

EXPONENTIAL GROWTH IN GUATEMALA

We are on track to equip 75 churches in community transformation directly impacting over 200,000 people in greatest need in urban, rural and indigenous communities throughout the country.



PIONEERING TRANSFORMATION IN NEPAL

We are on track to equip 50 churches in community transformation impacting 50,000 people in one of the poorest countries of the world. Even though Christians make up less than 1% of the population and often face discrimination and violence, churches want to engage their communities with a vision of unity and wholeness. The community transformation approach is proving to be an incredible bridge-building strategy that places local churches into the center of their communities, opening the way for local and regional impact.
